

FINANCIAL INFORMATION 2018-2019

TUITION AND REGISTRATION/ENROLLMENT

ONE TIME ENROLLMENT FEE: \$800.00	DUE MARCH 14, 2018
TUITION FOR 2018-2019 : \$9,100.00	Direct payment in full, one-half payment or FACTS account setup must be completed by MAY 1, 2018

TUITION PAYMENT OPTIONS

1. PAY IN FULL	Please issue a check payable to "Mount Carmel Academy." Attention: Finance Office via mail or delivery to school. Also, a family may create a FACTS account for processing this payment but it is not a requirement. For credit card payments not processed thru FACTS please call the finance office at (504)288-7626 x 2340. A credit card payment will be assessed a convenience fee of 2.75%.
2. TWO INSTALLMENTS	Payable via a FACTS account or directly to Mount Carmel Academy as stated for the Pay in Full option. The second installment is due November 1, 2018.
3. TEN EQUAL INSTALLMENTS *	For the period July 1st or 15th thru April 1st or 15th. This payment plan will have a FACTS fee of \$43.00 added to the tuition balance. Late Fees of \$25.00 per month will be assessed when deemed necessary.

A family who chooses the 10 installment payment plan is required to set up an account with FACTS where you can pay in one of the following ways:

- Direct debit from your checking account.
- Debit card.
- Credit card – which will include a convenience fee of 2.75%.

STUDENT INSURANCE

The Student Accident Plan is a program designed to reimburse parents/guardians for out-of-pocket expenses incurred from hospital, physician, and other medically necessary eligible expenses which occur as a result of an accident to their dependent child who is a full-time registered student in a school which has agreed to participate in the Religious and Charitable Risk Pooling Trust. The Plan is an "Excess" Plan over other valid coverage. Your family medical insurance is "Primary". If the parent/guardians are employed, but have no insurance, we must receive a letter to that effect on the employer's letterhead. If the parents can prove that they could not be covered by an employer sponsored plan, or unemployed with no access to coverage, then the student accident plan will be Primary.

ADDITIONAL COSTS

PICTURE/FEE DAY (AUGUST) Additional information about Picture/Fee Day that is held at the beginning of the school year will be communicated prior to that day.

- **FEES** - Fees vary from student to student. However, each student can expect their fee bill to range between \$350 to \$500. Fees include:
 1. Course Fees determined by individual student schedules
 2. Driver Education fee for Freshmen
 3. All books and E-books will be purchased either through MBS (online store) or the fee bill. Detailed information about ordering textbooks online will be sent to you.
 4. Please note that supplemental reading books may be obtained from other students or another source.
- **CUB SHOPPE** - Items will be available for purchase.
- **PICTURES** - Mandatory school pictures are taken by Loupe Photography. Parents may choose to purchase the pictures at a cost ranging from \$17 to \$49.
- **STUDENT ACTIVITIES** - There are other events/activities that may increase your costs, such as belonging to an athletic team, dance team, cheerleaders, attending the Father-Daughter Banquet, dues for various organizations, smaller scale events and the school-sponsored dances and proms. These are determined by your choice and degree of participation. If a club chooses to travel, travel expenses are not provided by the school.
